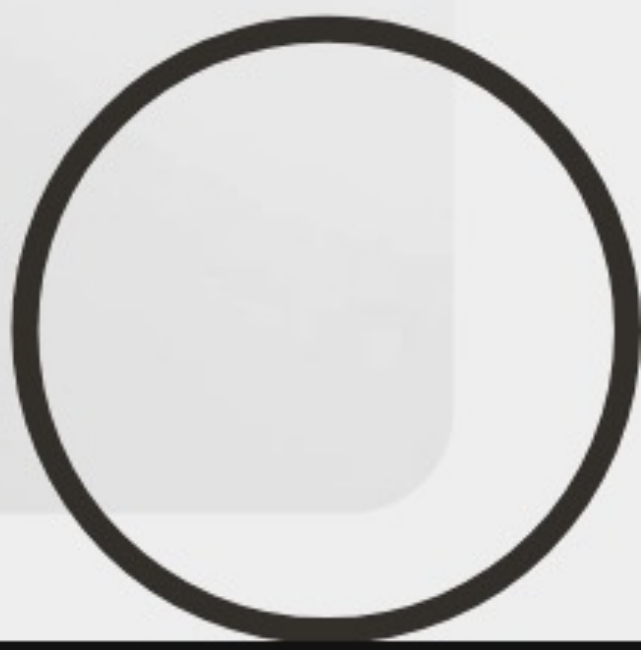
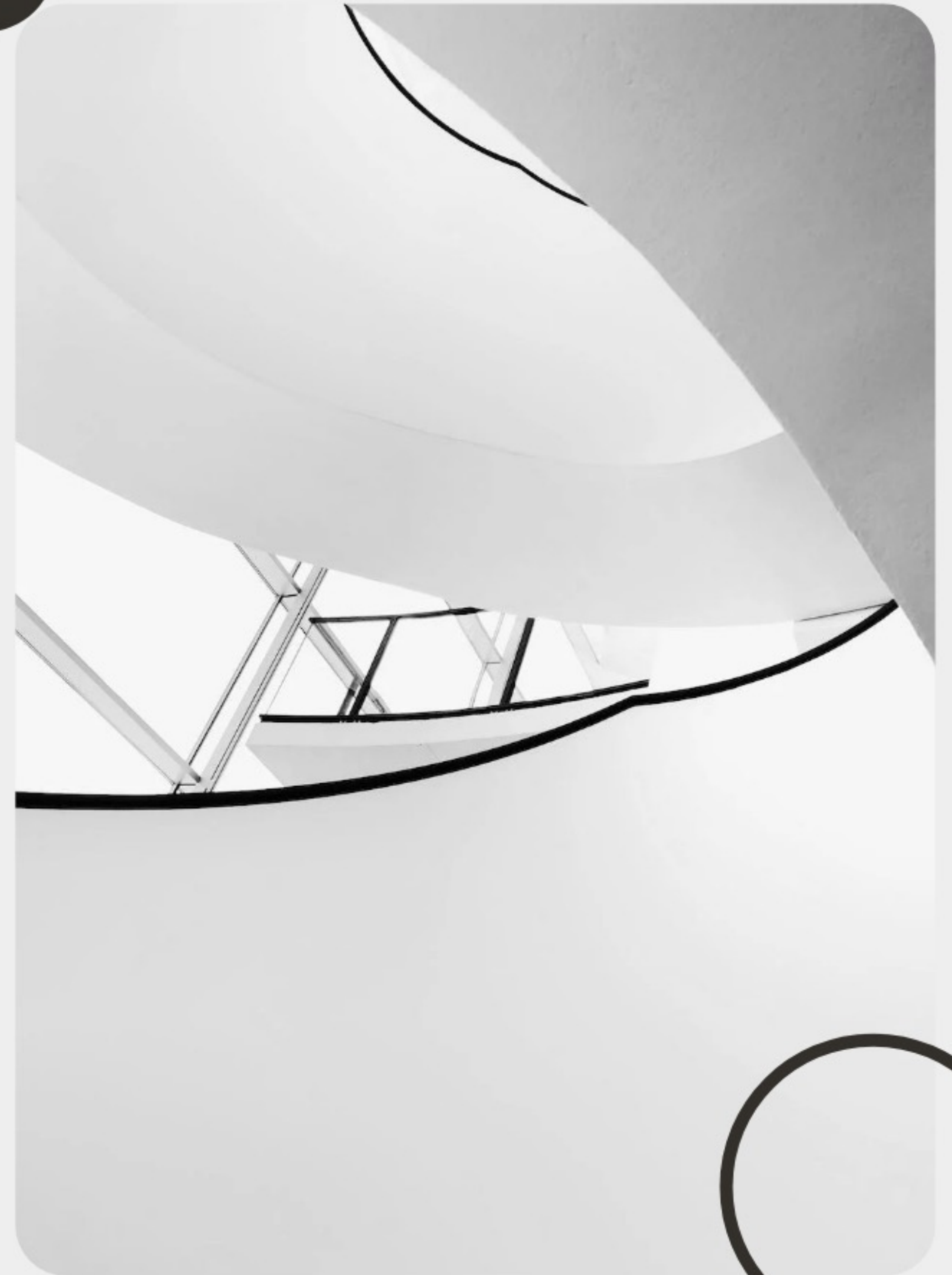

Examples of Biblical Themes

9. Creation and Stewardship: The Bible opens with the creation of the world, and the theme of humanity's role as stewards of creation recurs throughout the text.

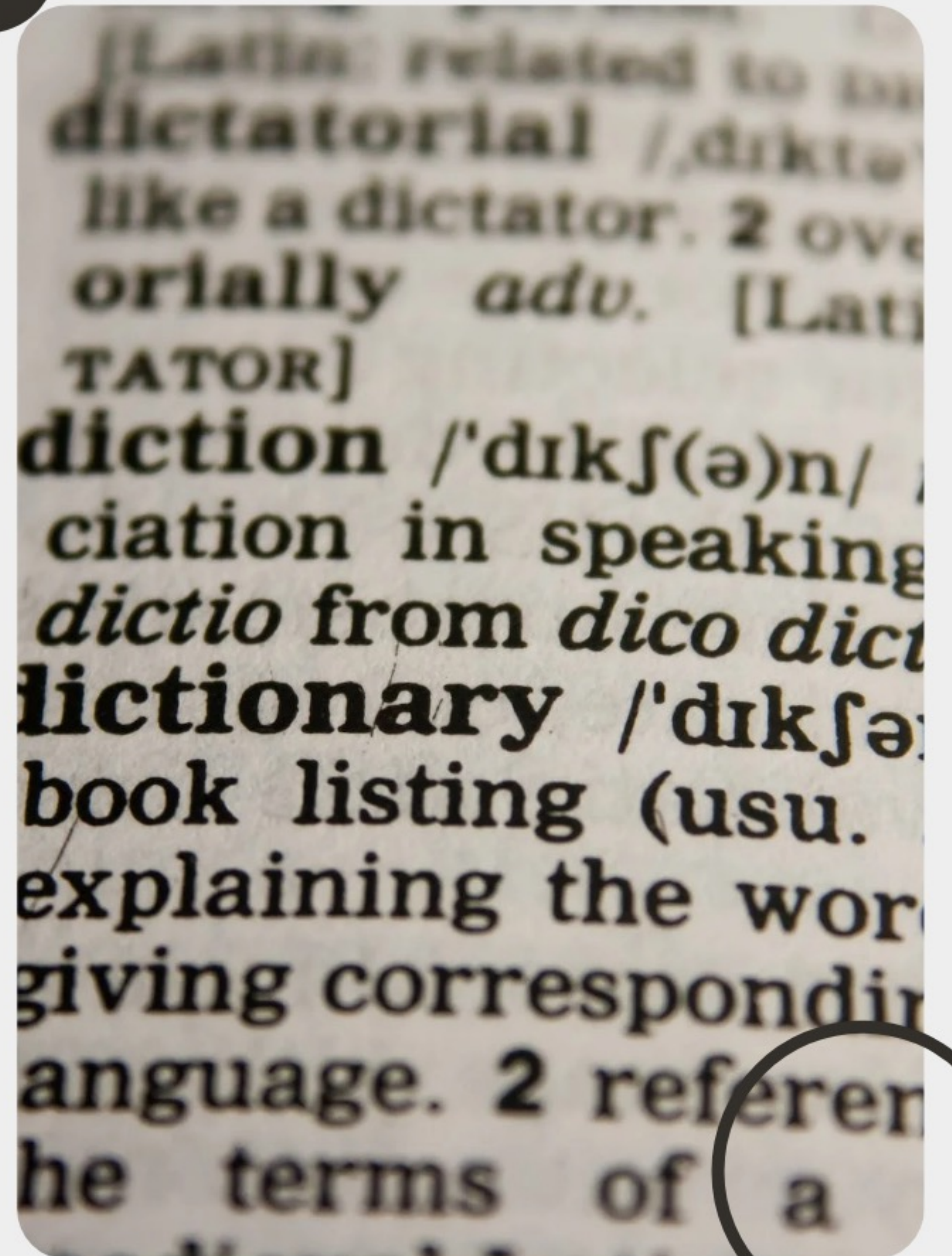
10. Suffering and Hope: The Bible does not shy away from the reality of human suffering but offers hope through faith in God.

Scripture: Genesis 1:1-31, Genesis 2:1-3

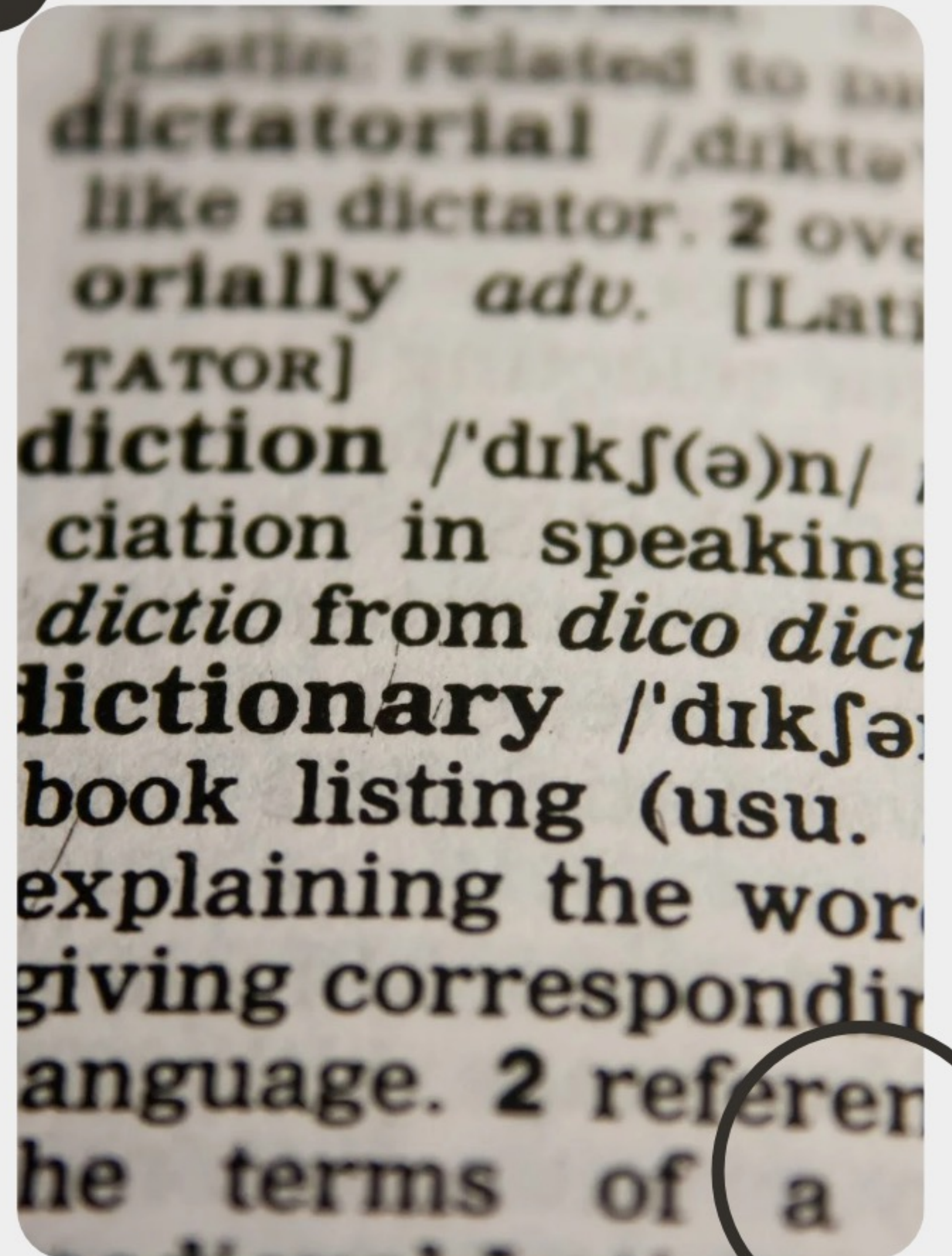


Finding the Big Stories

Scripture: Genesis 3:1-24

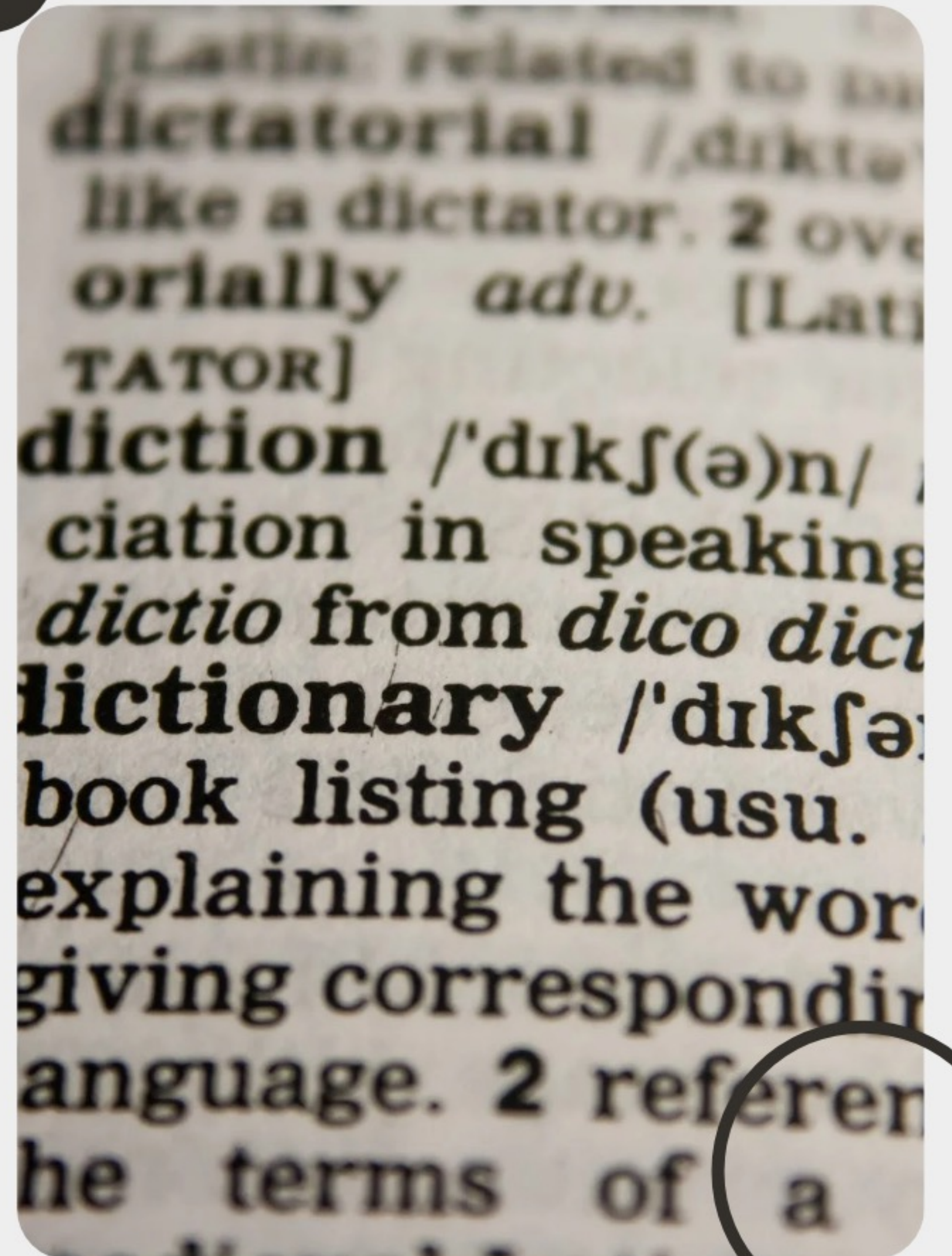


Finding the Big Stories

Scripture: Genesis 6:1-22, Genesis 7:1-24, Genesis 8:1-22, Genesis 9:1-17

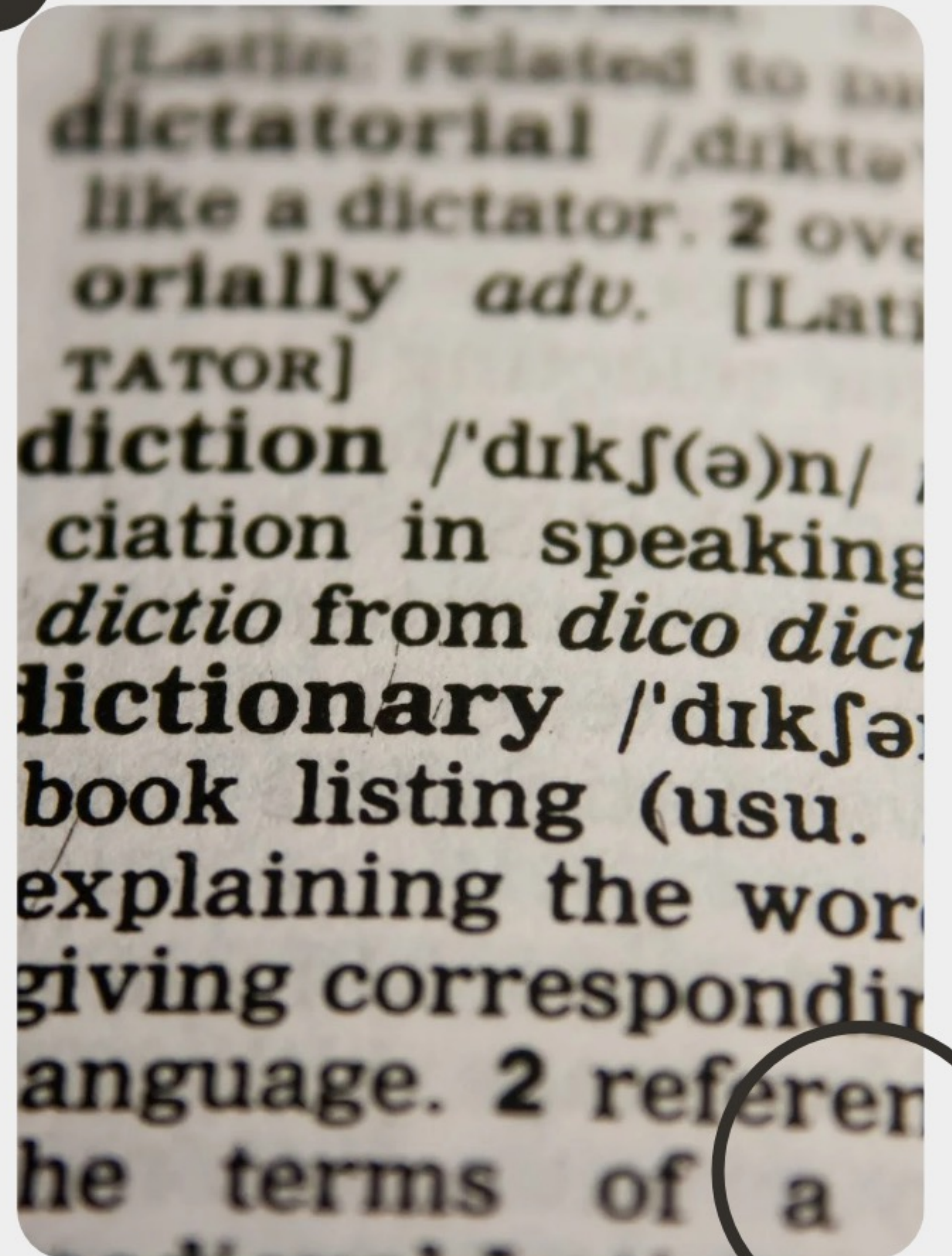


Finding the Big Stories

Scripture: Genesis 11:1-9

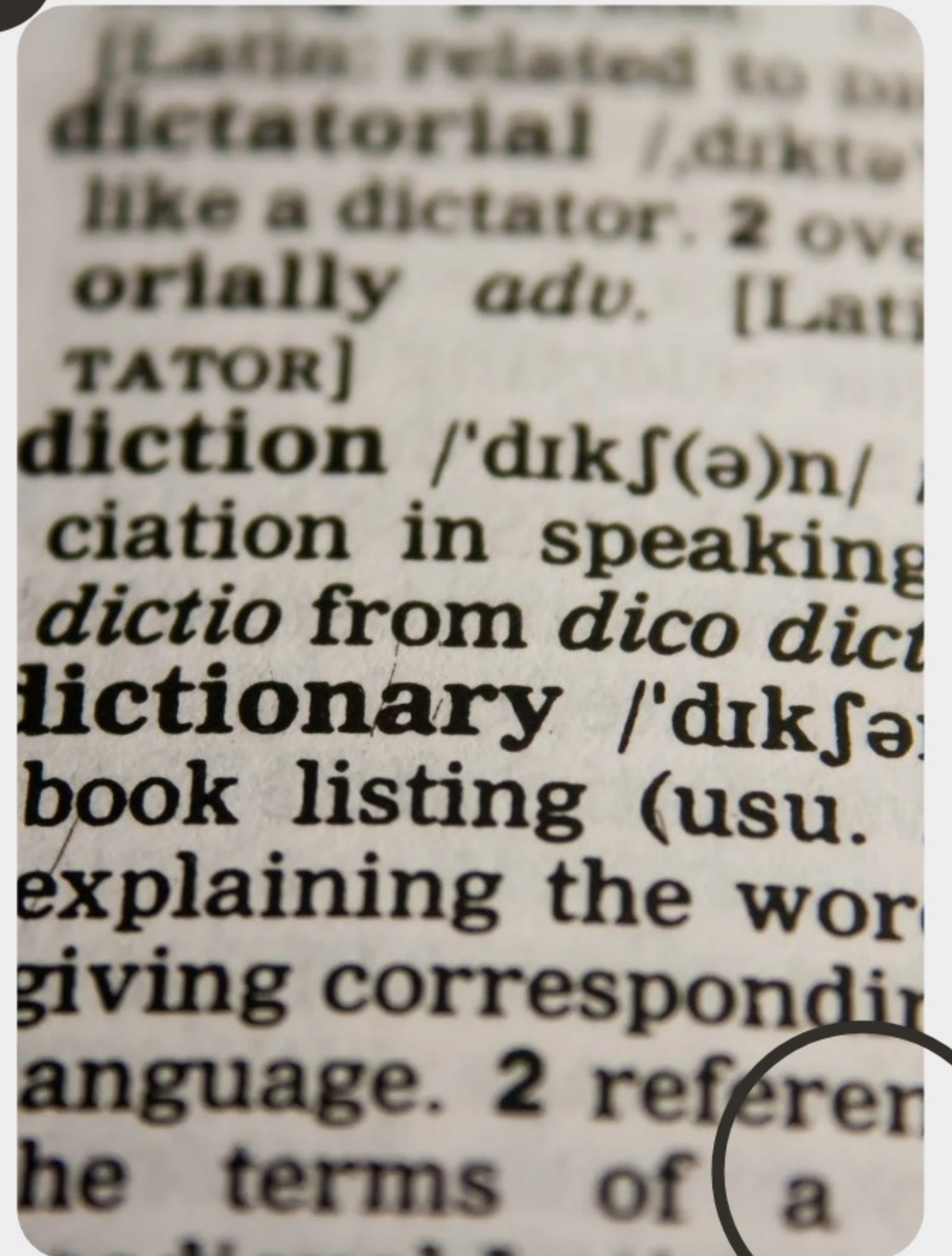
