3. Visit of the Magi: Matthew 2:1-12
Represents the world's recognition of Jesus as the Messiah.
4. The Baptism of Jesus: Matthew 3:13-17
Marks the commencement of Jesus' ministry, symbolizing hope and redemption.
5. The Sermon on the Mount: Matthew 5-7
Offers teachings of hope, love, and the promise of the kingdom of heaven.
6. Jesus' Miracles: Matthew 8-9
Demonstrates Jesus' power and compassion, instilling hope among people.
7. The Transfiguration: Matthew 17:1-13
Reveals the divine glory of Jesus, reinforcing the hope of salvation.
8. The Triumphal Entry: Matthew 21:1-11
Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, symbolizing the hope of a new kind of King.
9. The Crucifixion and Resurrection: Matthew 27-28
Central to Christian hope, showcasing victory over death and sin.
